

As you gather with friends, family, and others to prepare for and celebrate the arrival of Christ, we invite you to use the *Hope Ridge 2013 Advent Devotions* booklet as a focus (available at the Info Desk and online at hoperidge.com). By engaging in these daily devotions you can discover that God speaks words of hope, love, joy, and peace to you even in the midst of busyness, shopping, and travel.

Within the booklet are stories that are authentic to the community of Hope Ridge UMC. They are genuine insights and real stories that actually happened to people who participate in the life of this church and continue to follow Christ with their whole hearts. Children's Christmas Pageant during 10:30am service





November Report of Our Financial Support of the Hope Ridge Community & Ministries

Great news! Our offering in November exceeded our monthly needs, this is a step in the right direction, as we have a YTD shortfall of \$28,951 below our annual budget. As a result of your generosity in November, we were able to pay a portion of our conference apportionments, which supports the work of the United Methodist church locally and across the world.

Make a Tax-Free Gift to Hope Ridge From Your IRA

Did you know that under the extended charitable IRA legislation, if you are age 70½ or older, you can make a charitable gifts to Hope Ridge now using funds from your individual retirement accounts (IRAs) without undesirable tax effects?



Previously you would have had to report any amount taken from your IRA as taxable income. You could then take a charitable deduction for the gift, but only up to 50 percent of your adjusted gross income. In effect, this caused some donors to pay more in income taxes than they would have if they hadn't made a gift at all.

Fortunately, now these IRA gifts can be accomplished simply and without tax complications. Plus, you can make the gifts now—while you are living and able to witness the benefits of your generosity. This unique opportunity expires at the end of 2013.

You may contribute funds this way if:

- You are age $70\frac{1}{2}$ or older at the time of the gift.
- You transfer up to \$100,000 directly from your IRA. This opportunity applies only to IRAs; not other types of retirement plans.
- You transfer the funds outright to a qualified charity such as Hope Ridge.
- You make your gift by Dec. 31, 2013.

Your Benefits:

- The transfer generates neither taxable income nor a tax deduction, so you will receive the benefit even if you do not itemize
 your tax deductions.
- The transfer may count against your unsatisfied required minimum distribution for 2013. You'll make an immediate impact on us, allowing you to witness the benefits of your generosity.

How the Extended Law Works

Example: Lois, aged 80, has \$120,000 in an IRA and has pledged to give us \$15,000 this year. If Lois transfers \$15,000 to us directly from the IRA, she will avoid paying income tax on that amount. She cannot, however, claim a charitable deduction—it is a pure wash. Lois has found an easy way to benefit us without tax complications. If Lois's spouse has an IRA and is 70½ or older, he can also give up to \$100,000 tax-free to Hope Ridge.



Do You Shop Online?

Here's an easy way to go above and beyond your normal giving to Hope Ridge.





You're going, "NO WAY." But this **truly is** a win/win opportunity! This is the UMCmarket, a shopping portal that pays a commission of 1-9 percent of your online purchase to your church with no increased costs to you.

The United Methodist Church, in partnership with some of the largest online retailers, have built a shopping tool that provides a cash benefit for your church when you purchase through the UMCmarket -- items you'd probably be buying anyway. The retailer does not mark up the price — you still pay what you'd pay as you did before.

Simply create an account at UMCMarket.org designate "Concord Hope Ridge" and start shopping. It's that simple.

Fix flooring in kitchen Clean tile and grout in Café Fix door to the janitor's closet in office hallway Tuck point the chimneys and replace crown Tuck point the extension of the fire wall above the roof line - office wing to Chapel Finish the threshold on the emergency exit door in the Chapel Clean air duct screens throughout the church, especially Chapel Remove dead bushes Clean fans in Preschool bathrooms Put a light in the church office closet Fix carpet by side entrance to the WFLC (near choir room) Replace burned-out bulbs in outside fixtures Replace burned-out bulb on spot light that hits the cross by the new entrance Install child toilet in restroom and between Toddler Room and Nursery Paint front sign base Paint back door by offices

Take an inventory of the church contents (several people needed)

Paint living room ceiling Replace kitchen sink
